HAVE TO / DON'T HAVE TO

HOW TO USE IT

Use have to when you think it is necessary to do something or are obliged to do it. In negative sentences it means it is not necessary to do it.

EXAMPLES

- -I have to do my homework
- -You don't have to work tomorrow.
- -Sandra has to go to the dentist's.
- -She doesn't have to go now.

STRUCTURE

AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES

I/you/we/they have to work
HE/SHE/IT has to work

NEGATIVE SENTENCES Use don't or doesn't

I/you/we/they don't have to work HE/SHE/IT doesn't have to work

INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES Use do or does

Do I/you/we/they **have to** work? Yes, I do. No, I don't **Does** HE/SHE/IT **have to** work? Yes, he does. No, he doesn't. WH-QUESTIONS

What do you have to do tomorrow? I have to work.

What does she have to do tonight? She has to do her homework.


